HISTORY OF PATHARKANDI COLLEGE

Patharkandi College came into existence on 28th of Oct. 1990. It is situated 1. K.M away to the east of Patharkandi town. There is a big historical pond named Rajbari Pond in the east and Patharkandi College of education (B.Ed College) in the west. The

College Road runs from the National Highway to Rajbari Pond and also a PWD road approaches to the south. The College is surrounded by a charming place free from din and bustle environment. Though the Patharkandi College is under the jurisdiction of L.A.2 Patharkandi constituency and H.P-I Karimganj SC Lok Sabha (Reserved) Constituency, the huge population here are approximately 10 lacs, belonging to SC, ST, OBC, MOBC, Tea Garden General and Minority community almost 2/3rd of whom living Below Poverty Line. Patharkandi is one of the oldest revenue circles of the Karimganj district, but there was no any higher educational institution in this greater area. Prof. Quomrul Hoque was just then graduate and felt deeply the necessity of higher education at Patharkandi.

Prof. Quomrul Hoque took a bold step to start a college at Patharkandi. He began to hold public meeting in different corners and getting support from the well-wishers and wise-men and then he started degree classes at Rabindra Bhawan, Patharkandi. With a team of enthusiastic personalities, he started tiny collection of 10 (ten) paise, 50 (fifty) paise, 1(one) Rupee etc. in order to make an awareness and to know the people about his mission. Even paddy, betelnuts etc. were also collected from the locality.

Prof. Quomrul Hoque also managed a plot of k has land from the district administration at Rajbari, Patharkandi. The foundation stone of Patharkandi College was laid down by Sri. Suresh Ch. Panda, IAS, the then Deputy Commissioner Karimganj on the 28th oct.1990. This is the milestone of Patharkandi College. Then the classes were shifted to Rajbari M.E. School from Rabindra Bhawan temporarily. Construction of the College was continuing rapidly with small public collection and taking materials on credit from merchants. Thus, a large College building was constructed.

In the meantime, Quomrul Hoque completed his Master Degree in History from Guwahati University. After which, he was appointed as a lecturer of History at N.C. College Badarpur. Prof. Quomrul did not invest even a single penny for his future. Rather, he spent his total amount of his salary for the construction of Patharkandi College. He himself took classes at Patharkandi College whenever he got a free time. Gradually, the reputation of Patharkandi College started to be spread in every nook and corner of Barak Valley which is being continued till to day. The College received its affiliation from Assam University in 1999.

Prof. Quomrul approached to DPI, Guwahati for a College affairs and while returning home, unfortunately, he died in a mysterious car accident on 19th Oct. 1998. With the demise of Prof. Quomrul Hoque, the Patharkandi College was getting paralyzed. As a result, a few teachers and students remained in the College. In this way, the College ran for a few years. The College rejuvenated in the year 2004 with the entrance of his younger brother, the present principal, Dr. Monjurul Hoque who then just passed out M.A. from Assam University, Silchar. Then he rightly started to work to revive the College with an adamant mood and earned supports from teachers & co-operation from Patharkandi College Governing Body.

He moved with his staff's door to door to collect students and started classes regularly. Thus, the College got re-birth with its all-round development, especially the enrolment of students, good academic atmosphere along with attractive results every year accorded in the Assam University. However, owing to the all-round progress and prosperity, the Govt. of Assam has taken-up the College with effect from 1999. The College has already accorded permanent affiliation from the Assam University. It has 17 (Seventeen) Bighas of land of its own. The College has a big play ground with a tennis court. It has own library and free space of recreational facilities, canteen etc. The College has also its own website with internet connection. All the teaching and non-teaching staffs are good and dedicating. Being a newly provincialized College, the need of infrastructural development is very urgent. The College authority is looking forward to the kind attention of the UGC and the relevant corners for fulfilling the dream

Admission to the different subjects is selected by the admission committee on the basis of merits.

1. The dates of interview for admission to various classes are notified in advance. A list of eligible candidates for admission will be put up on the college website and notice board prior to the day of interview.
2. Students who are admitted on sports & music quota will have to show their performance as and when necessary, failing which their admission will be cancelled. Interview and admission will take place on the same day. The candidate will have to be present personally in the interview with the following documents and papers:
3. A candidate must produce the following documents in original along with the self - attested photocopies-
 - Mark sheet and Admit Card of the last qualification examination.
 - Age proof certificate
 - Two copies of recent passport size photographs.
 - Cast certificate from competent authority (Wherever necessary)
 - Income certificate from Circle officer (Wherever necessary)
 - An undertaking from the applicant and also his/her guardians that the applicant will not resort to ragging, in any form, must be submitted in the prescribed format at the time of admission.
4. Students passing the qualifying examination (10+2) earlier than the current year will have to submit a gap certificate (Max. 3 years).

OUR EXAMINATION AND EVALUATION

To evaluate academic performance of the students the following methods have been decided upon by the authority concerned:

The Unit Tests and Pre-final Test are compulsory for all students:

1. Unit Test- I: In between 2nd and 3rd week of the commencement of the session.
2. Unit Test- II: In between 6th and 7th week of the commencement of the session.
3. Unit Test- III: In between 9th and 10th week of the commencement of the session.
4. Pre-Final Exam: It will be held 15 days before of the commencement of the final exam

DISCIPLINE:

The College gives emphasis on discipline. Students are to abide by the Rules and Regulation prescribed by the College authority from time to time. Violation of rules, unsatisfactory academic progress, irregularity in attendance, showing discourtesy to teachers and staff, using unfair means in the examinations etc. will invite disciplinary actions like termination of scholarship, forced transfer and even expulsion from the College. No student organization shall be allowed to use College campus for organizing any activities without the permission of the principal. All notice desire to be pasted or circulated by the students anywhere in the College premises shall be required prior approval of the principal.

Code of Conduct

- Each student should behave sincerely in the college campus. They should behave politely with the teachers, non-teaching staff member and with fellow co-students. If the students face any problem, they should meet the concerned teacher, principal or vice-principal of the college.
- Students are expected to maintain the highest standards of discipline and dignified manner of behaviour inside as well as outside the College campus.
- Students should maintain their best behaviour in the college campus.
- Students should not engage themselves in activities which leads to defamation of the College.
- They shall abide by the rules and regulations of the College and should act in a way that highlights the discipline and esteem of the College.
- Uniform (dress code) and identity card is compulsory for each student in the campus. Only dresses of college uniform colour are allowed. Students should come clean and neatly dressed.
- Students should park their vehicles at the allotted places.
- Students should not roam around the campus and create nuisance at class hours.
- Smoking, drinking, chewing gutka, spitting and throwing clutter is strictly prohibited in the college campus.
- Students should avoid clicking pictures and use of cell phone without permission.
- Ragging or harassing juniors is strictly prohibited in the college premises and outside the campus as well. Students indulging in it will be punished severely. Such students will be expelled from the college and legal action will be taken against them.
- Students are prohibited from bringing any such weapons in the college which would physically harm others.
- Students should not damage classroom furniture, electrical appliances as well as walls by scribbling or doodling. Students will be punished and compensation would be taken if such things occur.
- Students are strictly forbidden to make any noise during ongoing classes and reading room.
- Students should maintain appropriate behaviour at office and library as well. These rules are compulsory for each and every student.
- After taking proper permission from authority students are allowed to organize any education trip and picnic only.
- No student should participate in any activity against the college and society. The students should also avoid caste and religion based unfair activities at college campus.
- Students should make an effort to participate in sports, cultural and other extra-curricular activities.
- At the time of examination, electronics devices are strictly prohibited. Copying in the examination and use of any unfair means will be treated as an offence and necessary action will be taken against the student.
- Students will not be allowed to constitute any Board or Associations or political groups without the permission of authority
- Misbehaviour towards girl students, use of threat or violence against members of the staff or fellow students will be considered as very serious cases of misconduct.

Central library

Patharkandi college provides a central library in the name of "Professor Quomrul Hoque Central Library " There is an average collection of essential books, journals, daily newspapers etc. Our college library provides facilities like e-journals, e-books, databases and the like. Our library work is managed smoothly with the "Koha software". The library also has a free Wi-Fi facility. There are also Xerox facilities available in the library, students may use xerox as and when necessary. In our library, there is a reading room allotted for both the teaching staff and students. Our college library wants to fulfil the teaching -learning process providing necessary requirements. By means of institutional membership, the users may also access e-resources of N-LIST, INFLIBNET. Our college library is run by qualified staffs. They are skilful and laborious and always helpful to students and teachers. They motivate the students to read as many books as possible. The catalogue is updated and books have been listed accordingly author wise and subject wise. college accommodates a collection of 2,500 books and 10 journals and magazines, complemented by various prominent national and local newspapers. Additionally, the library boasts a comprehensive Reference Collection, comprising dictionaries, biographies, educational philosophies, research methodology materials, resources on North-Eastern studies, religion, and literary works.

In our college library, daily Bengali and English newspapers are available. Moreover, there are journals kept in the library. The reading room is populous throughout the day. It is a memorable experience to sit in the library for one or two hours and study the magazines and newspapers.

The library operates between 9:00 A.M. and 4:30 P.M. on weekdays. Smart Library Cards will be given to students at the beginning of the academic session. For additional information, students can inquire directly at the library. The books are issued to the students for 7 days. They can also extend the time through renewal.
